Alternate Director's Report

FMCA Convention, Madison, WI
7-13 August 2011

Shirley and I arrived at Alliant Energy Center Sunday, August 7th about noon. We were glad we did not arrive any later as the coaches started coming in large numbers after we arrived. We had asked for parking in the Governing Board area with electric. That put us on asphalt (a good thing considering the rain we had later in the week) with much more room between rigs than we get at Indio. After settling in, we walked around the area to get a feel where the activities would be held. Our rig was about a quarter of a mile from the center of everything.

The facilities were over the top! Except for a couple of seminars and the coaches that were on display, all activities and venues were in air conditioned buildings and rooms. They even had multiple food vendors that were priced right. The number and quality of market place vendors were exceptional. There were very few vendors that were not RV related. They had several companies available to perform service on your rig. And, the number and diversity of seminars were absolutely amazing. Please remember, we have no other events of this scale to compare as we have only attended a couple of the Indio Western Area Rallies and one Good Sam National Rally, but we were very impressed!

Since we had free time on Monday, we decided to take advantage of it and toured the Monroe, WI area to see several of the "quilt barns" and the farms around that area.

Tuesday, I started off my day sitting in on the Candidates' Forum. Based on the presentations of the candidates and the questions asked, it was obvious that new member recruiting, member retention, finances, and Executive Board transparency to the Governing Board and the members were the central issues and the common thread of the various meetings I attended over the week. Other points that captured my attention were: need to focus on having activities at rallies and conventions that will draw families and have weekend rallies that will draw 40-50 year olds and still working members; need to make conventions finances break even or profitable; should FMCA be open to towable RVs? - a resounding "no" by all candidates; and need to match the conventions to the participation levels.

Wednesday, I attended the Governing Board Meeting. Highlights of the meeting are:

- President's Report -
 - FMCA is losing 500 to 600 members per month. With a potential membership market base of over one million registered motor homes in the US, we need to be aggressive about recruiting new members.
 - Attendance at conventions is declining. In 2005 attendance averaged 10K per convention. In 2010, attendance was down to 4K. While Perry and Pomona conventions tend to make money or break even, Redmond and Madison lose money. Attendance at Madison ended up about 75% of budgeted (1809 family coaches, 101 exhibitor live-in coaches, and 233 demo/display coaches).
- Treasurer's Report -
 - Recouped \$1.365M in Federal Taxes and \$12K in back interest by refilling earlier tax returns. These funds were placed in the investments and savings account.

- The Governing Board approved all actions of the Executive Board except:
 - The appointment of a committee to research the process, cost, issues, and benefits to establish a separate corporation to be affiliated with FMCA for self-contained towables and report back to the Executive Board in a timely manner.
 - The approval of holding the winter 2013 convention in Pomona, CA.
- Other highlights -
 - FMCA will begin issuing vinyl membership plates rather than plastic plates to new members. Vinyl plates will cost \$1.79 for two plates for the coach and one for the toad compared to \$16.90 for two plates for the coach.
 - At a point, providing free medical evacuation coverage (FMCAssist) will become a concern if membership continues to decline.
 - With the approved changes to the budget, there is an approximate surplus of \$57K for FY 2012.
- Future Conventions -
 - Until the financial situation reverses, there will be one convention per year.
 - Each Chapter is encouraged to develop a "stuffed" mascot and to bring it to the 2012 Convention in Indianapolis, IN.
 - Actions are underway to develop a "virtual" convention in 2012. Participants will sign up online, pay a fee, and participate in seminars, etc., virtually at any time.
 - The 2013 50th Anniversary Convention will be held in August at Hutchinson, KS. The theme is "Mile Marker 50".
 - The 2014 Convention will be in the winter in Perry, GA.
- Membership Services -
 - National Headquarters has rolled out "Campground Connections". This is an on-line directory of campgrounds that provide a discount to FMCA members. It is based on Google Maps which allows you to bore down to find campgrounds in the vicinity of where you will be traveling. By clicking on the location, a window will pop up with specifics about that campground. Chapters are encouraged to select these participating campgrounds for their rallies.
 - FMCA has entered into a partnership with Sam's Club. Gift cards of various denominations will be given to FMCA members for joining/renewing their Sam's Club membership.
 - Fantasy RV Tours has partnered with FMCA to provide discounts to FMCA members.
 - Michelin Tire has also partnered with FMCA.
- Officer Elections -
 - Charlie Schrenkel was elected President by a vote of 189 to 176 with 3 ballots invalid.
 - Allen Rein was elected Senior VP by a vote of 219 to 148.
 - Will Young was re-elected Treasurer by a vote of 226 to 141.
 - Vicky Ferrari was elected Secretary by a vote of 294 to 73.

Friday, I attended the INTO Area Business Meeting. After the governing board acted on several business items, Sonny reported that there will not be an INTO Area Rally in 2012. That afternoon, Shirley and I

drove to "The House on the Rock". Several folks we had talked to said that this was a "must do". We certainly agree! If you have not been there, you have to put this one on your "bucket list".

On Saturday morning, Shirley and I attended the *General Membership Meeting*. Nothing new from the *Governing Board* meeting was presented.

Saturday afternoon, Shirley and I hosted a gathering of Alfa owners (both SeeYas Chapter members and non-members). 21 folks had indicated an interest in attending and 19 showed - After pizza, Phil Gates, who was going to join the Chapter, had his number drawn for a free membership! We handed out four membership application forms. It was a pretty good showing, but cut short due to a sudden rain storm.

This was our first time to attend a convention as well as the first as a member of the *Governing Board*. It was an eye opener and a great week of more activities and seminars we could ever imagine. We had a great time!

Camp-California Guide Expanded

Camp-California Guide - The Camper's Guide to California from the California Association of RV Parks and Campgrounds, has tripled its database with the addition of government-run campgrounds and private campgrounds that are not affiliated with the statewide campground association.

The recently completed additions increased the database from 350 parks to more than 1,000 campgrounds, said Debbie Sipe, executive director of the association. She added that a digital version of the guide is available at www.camp-california.com.

The association plans to add the nearly 1,000 Forest Service campgrounds to its database next year.

In addition to campground listings, the guide also provides activities and events held throughout California during the year, as well as fun facts about the state.

50-AMP TESTING

I have a 2008 Fleetwood Bounder 38P with 50-amp service. When I go to an RV park, I want to test the power box before plugging in. How do I test the receptacle?
DUANE HUNSTAD: HASTINGS, MINN

I suspect you want to test to see if the voltage is adequate, Duane. The best way to test a 50-amp receptacle is with a multi-meeter set to AC volts with at least a full scale reading of 300 volts.

Insert the probes into the two flat-blade openings that are on each side of the receptacle. You should get 240 volts plus or minus 5 percent, or 228 to 252 volts. If it passes that test, remove one probe and insert it into the bottom flat-blade opening. You should get 120 volts plus or minus 5 percent, or 114 to 126 volts. If it passes that test, remove the remaining side probe and insert it into the flat-blade opening on the other side. Again, you should get 120 volts plus or minus 5 percent or 114 to 126 volts.

Once you plug in, you can test for a ground with a plug-in tester available at most hardware and RV parts stores. It will also tell you if the wiring is correct.

A motorhome with 50-amp service has two buses in its circuit breaker box. Ideally, you want to test both buses with the plug-in tester, but you may not be able to do so. All 120-volt receptacles may be on one bus, with the other bus supplying other 120-volt devices such as a second air conditioner. An electrician can open the circuit breaker box and tell you what is on each bus.

Toast a Great Finish

Often a great travel day ends with a simple supper of toast, topped with a light but tasty finish. Try these variations on the popular Blushing Bunny you remember from Mother's kitchen:

1 can condensed low-sodium cream of tomato soup

8-ounce package process cheese such as Velveeta

Using a heavy saucepan over low heat, a double boiler or a microware container, gently heat soup and cheese, stirring often until smooth and hot. If mixture is too thick, thin it with a little cream or milk. Spoon over hot, buttered toast or one of the following:

Finish #1 - Stir a small can of baked beans into cheese mixture. Heat, and serve on hot, buttered toast.

Finish #2 - Stir finely diced cooked ham into cheese mixture and spoon on hot, buttered rye toast.

Finish #3 - Top each piece of hot, buttered toast with a fried egg and finish with tomato-cheese sauce.

Finish #4 - Drain and flake tuna over hot, buttered toast and top with tomato-cheese sauce.

HEARTY CHILI

10 oz. extra lean ground turkey breast

1 medium onion, diced

2 (28 oz.) cans diced tomatoes

2 medium zucchini, diced

2 medium yellow squash, diced

1 (1 ¼ oz.) package dry chili seasoning

1 (15 oz.) can black beans, rinsed & drained

2 (15 oz.) cans low sodium beef broth

4 celery stalks, diced

2 green bell peppers, diced

1. Spray large nonstick skillet with nonstick spray and set over medium high heat. Add turkey and onion, sauté until browned, about 5 minutes.
2. Transfer browned turkey and onion mixture to a large soup pot and add tomatoes, zucchini, squash, beans, broth, celery, bell peppers and chili seasoning. Bring to a simmer over medium heat. Continue to simmer until veggies are tender, about 30 minutes.

PER SERVING: (1 cup) 76 calories, 1 G fat, 270 mg sodium, 3 G fiber

OREGON AREA**Our painted Alfa, by Patty Rowe**

Is that a 2011, you might ask? No, but she looks brand new, better than new in my opinion. We came close last year to trading our Alfa for an expensive SOB (which stands for "some other brand"). Luckily we came to our senses. We LOVE our 2005 Alfa Gold and always have (not to mention the many friends we see at Alfa rallies). The interior is set up exactly like we need it in order to live and run our business six months each winter in the desert. But we thought the outside was looking a little dated,

and our decals were shrinking and getting a bit ratty. And when we thought about that SOB we nearly bought, we realized the thing we liked best about it was the gorgeous paint job. So we decided to treat our Alfa to full-body paint. Not the cheapest thing, but a lot less expensive than that SOB.

Since we live near Junction City, OR, during the summer months, Don was sure he could find some highly qualified painters here, now that the RV industry has pretty much folded up. Did he ever! We had two painters with over 20 years' experience each painting high-end motorhomes. And a long-time service technician who helped them, taking off and reattaching everything, and fixing anything that needed it.

I created the basic design, working from a photo of our Alfa. The painters (I should say "artists") added touches of their own that I would never have even thought of. The result is a real head-turner, with some very special features, like gold pin stripes, drop shadows, cream pearl, and "marble" done with an airbrush that looks like the real thing. Topped off with 5 clear coats, it's so shiny you could use it as a mirror to apply your makeup.

The cost, and time it takes, all depends on what you want. They can do everything from steaming off your decals and painting them back on, to the limits of your imagination. These highly skilled craftsmen have each painted thousands of high-end coaches during their careers. They are professional, talented, honest, and we feel reasonable for the quality of work they turn out.


