

GO NUTS - LIVE LONGER? From Health Net

Are nuts your snack of choice? Good news. A large new study found eating nuts regularly - in moderation of course - may cut heart risk and help you live longer.

Researchers followed 120,000 people for 30 years. Their findings, published in the New England Journal of Medicine: The biggest nut eaters among them - those who ate an ounce or handful daily - were more likely to live longer.

"The most obvious benefit was a reduction of 29 percent in deaths from heart disease. But we also saw a significant reduction - 11 percent - in the risk of dying from cancer" during the study, said lead researcher Charles Fuchs of the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston.

What makes tiny nuts so mighty? They're rich in heart-healthy fiber, omega-3 fatty acids, protein and disease-fighting antioxidants, the study says. Plus, researchers found people who eat them are more likely than non-nut eaters to have healthy lifestyles - not smoke, exercise regularly and maintain a normal weight.

So go nuts! But don't go crazy. The key is moderation. This study is about eating a handful not a bowl full of nuts a day. Nuts may be healthy, but they still contain a lot of calories. So take it easy. Your best bet: unsalted nuts. Skip salted, honey-roasted and chocolate-covered varieties!

ALFA TECH-1

The following information is based on articles from RV publications and personal experience. They are not meant to substitute for your good judgment, experience and safety.

- Five companies make tires for motor homes. Other tire companies make tires designed for truck use. Truck tires are not meant to be run for seven years. Following are the RV tire manufacturers and the number of models of tires, that they manufacturer. The specific tire for your use will depend on the size of your tire which will dictate the appropriate model. Also, you want to avoid tires manufactured in China. You can find out who made the tire and where it was made by reading the first two digits on the DOT date and looking up the information at one of two sites: www.harriger.com/tires.htm or www.nhtsa.gov/rules/manufacture/indes.htm. Be sure to request current DOT dates and require that the DOT date be mounted on the outside of the tire:
 - Continental makes two tires
 - Goodyear makes one tire
 - Michelin makes four tires
 - Sumitomo makes three tires
 - Yokohama makes one tire

The FMCA Michelin Advantage program has been enhanced to include cars & trucks

Michelin is recalling over a million tires. They are Michelin LTX tires, size LT 225/75R1, DOT dates 0210 to 2512.


- For new members of Costco or the Good Sam club, if you signup through FMCA

- K&N makes air filters for cars and RV's. The new filters do not require oiling.
 Just wash and dry.
- If you have a blind spot on the left or right of your car or RV, use a small stick on mirror that can easily correct your vision.
- If you have problems with your back up camera or monitor, I recommend RV Cams, Inc. (877) 378-2267. www.Tim@RVCams.com.
- If you need to remove a fuse before you tow, Roadmaster makes four Fuse Master units that allow you to switch the fuse off. (800) 669-9690 www.roadmasterink.com
- If you have a Norcold refrigerator and have added the heat switch that turns off the refrigerator at high temp, you can reset the switch with a magnet to the top right corner of the switch. BUT be sure the switch turning off is not because of a fire condition.

Our 15 rigs stayed in RV parks that were adequate and safe, each with an adjacent restaurant serving delicious food and "plentiful margaritas".



Your registration form and fees must be received by the Wagon Masters **No Later Than July 1, 2014**. Since the RV park has only allowed us 15 RV spaces for our pre-rally (and your wagon masters and co-wagon masters are taking 1 each) - that means there are only 13 RV spaces allowed for our pre-rally - so please make your reservations as soon as possible!

Pre-rally attendees who are going on to the FMCA 90th Family Reunion in Redmond, PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. If you want to park with the AlfaSeeYas Chapter, you must register for the FMCA 90th Family Reunion <u>separately</u> online or by snail mail, AND you will need to sign up for the "Registration Fee" and the "Additional Fee for 30-amp Electric Only" option, AND specify that you will be arriving with a scheduled caravan (the AlfaSeeYas). If you do not select and pay for the 30-amp Electric option, you will be parked in the generator area and not with the Chapter.
- 2. You should arrive at the Pre-rally RV park with enough propane to cook, shower, and heat water and your rig during the FMCA Rally. [Note: propane is not available at the Olde Stone Village RV Park, but there is an RV dealer, RV Warehouse, outside and just west of the entrance to the park where you can get propane Monday-Saturday, 9-5. We suggest filling up when you arrive in McMinnville.] For the FMCA Rally in Redmond, we will probably not have electric power the day we arrive (Aug 11), as it is scheduled to be available starting 9 am on Aug 12 (and be available until 9 am Aug 17). Once we have electric at the FMCA Rally, it will be 30 amp service, so you will need to maximize the use of your propane water heater, stove/oven and furnace, and minimize simultaneous use of electrical devices such as your stove/oven and furnace, and minimize simultaneous use of electrical devices such as your microwave/convection oven, hair dryers, air conditioner, etc. Remember, if you lose power from overloading the circuit, so may a bunch of other folks who will not be "happy campers."
- 3. You should dump your grey and black holding tanks and fill your fresh water tank while you are at the pre-rally RV park, preferably on Sunday evening before we depart on Monday for the FMCA Rally in Redmond.

4. We will be departing the morning of Monday Aug 11 to caravan to the FMCA Rally in Redmond. Redmond is approximately 150 miles away from the pre-rally site. We will plan to depart at 9 am, with our intent to arrive at the holding site in Redmond in order for us to go in to the Rally at 2 pm. Naturally, it could be difficult for all our rigs to stay together for that great a distance. We will provide directions to all who are going with us, and allow plenty of time for everyone to gather up at the FMCA Rally holding site in Redmond. We will also assign one rig to be the leader, and one to be the "tailgater" to assist if anyone is having problems keeping up.

Detailed Pre-Rally Schedule

Thursday, August 7

Arrival Day. Please note that the RV park check-in time is 1 PM. We will greet you as you enter the park and give you a welcome packet containing pre-rally and local area information. After you get set up, please take a few minutes and review the materials in the packet.

Social Hour and Dinner. We will meet in the Clubhouse at 5 PM for a social hour (BYOB), and then have a catered dinner at 6 pm. Dinner will be catered BBQ - with brisket, chicken and pulled pork, with sides of baked beans, potato salad and coleslaw. Plates, utensils and napkins, plus iced tea and lemonade will also be provided. After dinner, we will discuss the optional caravanning to dinner on Saturday night and take a poll of who would like to go, and we will discuss caravanning to the FMCA Rally in Redmond.

Friday, August 8

Continental Breakfast. The Chapter will provide coffee, juice and rolls available between 8 and 10 am, located at the wagon master's site.

You will be in the heart of the Willamette Valley wine country, with hundreds of wineries within easy driving distance. Downtown McMinnville is the site of many quaint shops and boutiques and numerous restored historic buildings. (If you arrive in time on Thursday, the weekly downtown farmers' market is worth a

General Information for the FMCA Rally

[Note: there is a lot of information available on the FMCA.org web site, under Conventions, Redmond 2014. Check especially the FAQs.]

Electricity will be available at the FMCA Rally starting at 9 am on Tues Aug 12, and will end at 9 am Sun Aug 17. An extension electric cord may be necessary if your motorhome cord does not reach the provided 30-amp receptacle (sometimes the receptacle may be located at the front of each parking space). FMCA also encourages members to have surge protectors on power cords leading to the electrical panel. Since we will be arriving the afternoon of Mon Aug 11, we will be able to use our generators that afternoon and evening, until the power is turned on Tues morning.

All parking will be at the Deschutes County Fair and Expo Center, where most RVs will be parked on crushed lava rock.

FMCA will have available an outside dump station, plus a roving pump out service that may be purchased at the Rally. Fresh water will be available at the Rally site, plus it may be purchased at the Rally for delivery to your RV.

The weather in Redmond at this time of year is mostly sunny days, with an average high temperature in August of 85 degrees.
