Jean Maddux has done yeoman work in this position for many years and deserves a break. I know we have members who have the talent to take this on, and Jean will help you get started.

As I mentioned in a previous issue, chapter member Jeannette Harper volunteered to take over maintenance of our website and she has been working closely with outgoing webmaster Tony Monson in this effort. They are currently in the process of selecting a new host which will provide capabilities that our current server does

not have. The transition to the new site should be seamless to users; that is when you type or click on alfaseeyas.com, you will automatically go to the new site. There may, however, be a day or two of downtime where the site is not available. Many thanks to Jeannette and Tony for their service to our chapter.

Changing topics a bit, our chapter has 193 member families, spread throughout 34 states and provinces. In 2016 we had 78 members who did not renew. With aging coaches (and aging members), it is not too surprising that we have had a loss in membership, but we also added 28 new members in 2016, better than two per month. New owners are still buying Alfa coaches, and some long-time owners are joining FMCA and the AlfaSeeYas for the first time.

In order to reach even more Alfa owners and encourage them to join, the Executive Board recently approved the following program for the year 2017:

- For new members who join between now and the end of this year, the normal \$20 charge for the application fee and one year's dues will include a second year of membership for free.
- Any current member who refers a new member will receive an additional year of their own membership for free. There is no limit on this - for example, if you recruit three new members this year, you won't have to pay chapter dues for three years.

Many of us know Alfa owners who don't belong to FMCA or the chapter, and we often meet

other owners in our travels. This is a chance to offer them an incentive to join us. To help you out, we have included a membership application at the end of this newsletter, and if you need more you can print them from the alfaseeyas.com website. (Make sure your name is included on the "Referred By" line for members you recruit).

I encourage you to familiarize yourself with the benefits that come with FMCA membership (go to fmca.com and click on the "Benefits" tab). When you talk to prospective members, be sure to explain the FMC Assist Medical Emergency and Travel Assistance Program. Most people think that this benefit alone is worth the cost of membership. And tell your "recruits" to mention your name when they join FMCA - you will get a "bennie" from FMCA; I think it's currently a \$10 coupon.

I usually include a list of upcoming events in this column, but you will find that info elsewhere in this newsletter. Lori and I will be attending the FMCA Chandler convention in Chandler, AZ in March and the AlfaSeeYas NASCAR rally in Fontana, CA later in March. We had signed up for the FMCA International Area Rally in Branson, MO in May, but it looks like I will be having knee replacement surgery instead (what fun). We have invitations to weddings in Washington in July and Colorado in August, so our summer travels will be planned around those events. Maybe we will "SEE YA" out on the road; until then, safe travels.

2017 Western Area Rally and AlfaSeeYas Pre-Rally

As we have done now for many years, a group from the AlfaSeeYas chapter attended the FMCA Western Area Rally in Indio, CA in January, preceded by a "pre-rally" at the Emerald Desert RV Resort in nearby Palm Desert, CA.

There was a total of 16 coaches and 31 people at the pre-rally, including three couples who were new members and first timers. Wagon Masters Dale & Diana Manners and Doug & Mary Barr did a great job arranging a week of fun activities and socializing. Members were greeted as they arrived at the park on Thursday and given welcome bags and schedules for the five-day pre-rally. That evening we gathered in our private club room for introductions and a welcome dinner catered by Dickey's Barbecue. Everyone enjoyed renewing old acquaintances and meeting the new members.

Starting on Friday morning, early birds assembled back in the club room for our daily gathering for coffee and a variety of breakfast goodies. Some members remarked that they consider these times the highlight of the rally, as we discuss and resolve the problems of the world in general and our coaches in particular. The rest of Friday was free for us to enjoy the activities of the Palm Desert area on our own, until we gathered again in the evening for a social hour with hearty hors d'ourves.

Saturday morning was busy. Our chapter business meeting followed morning coffee, and the meeting was followed by our annual session with Jon Goldstein and Martin Miranda of Leisure Coachworks. Jon and Martin updated us on the latest happenings at their company, including their expansion into a neighboring building with additional service bays. As always, they patiently answered many questions from our members.

On Sunday morning, about half of the pre-rally group went on an optional tour of the windmill turbine farm in the Palm Springs area. The tour guides described the history of using windmills to generate electric power and we then walked through an outdoor yard containing historic windmills, including some designs that did not pan out so well. We then were taken on a mini-bus tour through several areas of currently operational windmills, and got to step out and see how big they are when you see them up close.

On Sunday evening we returned to our other major activity - eating !! We gathered for a "partial pot luck" dinner ~~ the wagon masters brought in tons of fried chicken and the rest of us provided side dishes and desserts. On Monday, the last full day of the pre-rally, those who were going to the main rally filled and emptied their tanks as appropriate, and that evening we had our final dinner in the park clubhouse. Dinner was followed by several

hands of playing card bingo, while the football fans kept an eye on the TV showing the college football National Championship game.

On Tuesday morning, the four coaches which had signed up for the Western Area Rally caravanned over to the Indio fairgrounds, where we would stay until Sunday morning. The Western Area folks put on their usual good show, with plenty of new coaches to look at, vendors to spend money at, and seminars to get smarter at. Most evenings featured entertainment in the main auditorium. As with last year, we had a few days of rain during the rally, and while it may have dampened the fairgrounds, it didn't dampen the spirits of those in attendance.

An informal poll of attendees at the pre-rally, indicated that most would like to do it again next year. The dates for the Western Area Rally in 2018 will be January 9-14, so we will probably have a post-rally from January 14-19. Although the pre/post rally has been held at the Emerald Desert Resort for many years, we are currently exploring other options for next year. **We need people to step up to be wagon masters !!** As an incentive, the Executive Board voted that those volunteering to be wagon masters will be reimbursed for the rally registration cost (site fee and basic registration, including an early arrival day). One of our new member couples has already volunteered to be assistant wagon masters and would like to work with a couple with more experience attending rallies. It is not that hard a job, and we have information from past rallies that will help you get started. FMCA UPDATE

We recently had the opportunity to hear FMCA National President Charlie Adcock talk about the current state of the Association, especially regarding membership.

As most of you know, FMCA membership has declined over the years, probably for a variety of reasons. Compared to a high of 129,000 in 2004, membership currently stands at 71,000. New members were being signed up in pretty good numbers, but they weren't being retained. A couple of years ago, the FMCA officers and staff started a project to reverse the decline, working with a contractor which they hired (Membership Corporation of America). They also brought back the FMCA Assist program as part of the basic membership. These efforts finally paid off in 2016 when for the first time in many years the Association had a net gain of 616 members. Charlie stated that this gain came at a big cost. A call center was established and new members are called at the 45, 60 and 180-day point. This is not to try to sell them anything but to see if they have any questions and to help them understand their FMCA benefits. They are also sent short e-mails at various times. It looks like these initiatives are starting to pay off in member retention.

FMCA has not neglected existing members. Sometime in late 2016 you should have received a packet with new member materials, including new membership cards with current phone numbers, including the one for the FMCA Assist program. Members were asked to call FMCA when they received the packet; of course, very few of them did. If you do not remember receiving your packet with the new ID cards, call FMCA at 800-543-3622 and they will send you one.

You may remember that also in 2016, members were asked to vote on a change to the FMCA Articles of Incorporation. This change, which was passed, removed the restriction that limits the FMCA Corporation to motor homes only. Of course this led to speculation that FMCA was going to allow towables. In his talk in January, Charlie did not indicate that any decision had been made as to further moves in this direction. We have since learned, however, that a proposal will be voted on at the July Governing Board meeting which would open FMCA to all recreational vehicle owners. If approved by the Governing Board, the change would then be submitted to the entire Association membership for a vote.

I will send out more information, either in a future newsletter or a separate mailing, once we receive more details from FMCA.



