Dear Everyone (especially Alfa owners),

Our Story

I retired from officially working as an Electrical Inspection Supervisor for the state of Washington and obtaining my retired pay for USAF retirement with 21 years (8 active duty) the rest with the Air National Guard) on May Day 2000. My wife Sharon and I decided that we could now do a bit of traveling and maybe see some of our US of A.

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We purchased a pickup and 5th wheel trailer (SOB) and took our first trip towards Branson, MO. We hit a few Wal-Marts along the way and a few RV parks. We made it to Branson and extended our original 2 weeks to 3. Sharon says to me, "You know, it's not that far to Graceland." so off we went to Memphis and spent a week there and did the Elvis thing. Then she says, "It's not that far to Nashville." Another 2 weeks just outside Nashville, 2 trips to the Grand Ol' Opry, and actually getting to sit right down in front when a kindly usher picked us after all the handicap people had been given seats in the front row. Two great shows. Then it was my turn, "It's not much further to the Atlantic Ocean". And we were sitting on the beach at Virginia Beach watching the 4th of July fireworks out over the ocean. Next, we both said, "Not that far to Washington DC". We spent 3 weeks there on Andrew AFB in their FamCamp and that wasn't long enough to really see all the great museum and monuments, but we got most of them. Then we headed back to Washington state and arrived - instead of a 3 or 4-week trip it was 3 months later.

Our trip then had us thinking. Instead of parking the 5th wheel for a month or two, we were only staying a week or two wanting to see the great US of A. As we were setting up numerous times in the RV and State parks, we noticed the motor homes coming in. They would park, lower the jacks, level, hook up water and electric and have a beer open and watching me finish setting up the 5th wheel. We wanted a motor home. We sold our house, did some shopping but prices etc. kept us in the 5th wheel until we were down in Casa Grande, AZ and happened to stop at an RV sales event. I noticed a lot of people waiting in line to look at what I first thought was an Alfa trailer, (not the 5th wheel we were used to seeing). So, I stood in line and

ROOF AND SIDEWALL RESEALING:

To keep water from getting into your side walls, which can cause blistering; it is important to seal all top and side joints. We had Leisure Coachworks do ours and they did a great job. The products used are Dicor 502LSW self-leveling on the roof and Sikaflex-221 on the sides. You will need to remove as much of the old sealing as possible before you add the new. Carry a tube of Dicor with you when you travel.

after stepping up into it, I noticed the steering wheel. "What kind of Alfa trailer is this?" I asked. They said it's Alfa's new motor home - 4 televisions, 4-door refer, separate freezer in the basement alongside the outdoor television, whole house A/C Heat pump, separate gas furnace, very nice 330 HP Cat engine. And a decent price. This was the second model Alfa made.

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After haggling with different dealers, we found a price to satisfy us in Colton, CA and traded in the pickup and 5th wheel and rode along as they delivered it to us in Ehrenberg, AZ out of California. We were now proud owners of a 2002 Alfa motor home, serial #354. Without a tow vehicle we even used it to go grocery shopping from the RV park we were staying in at the time. Finally, after getting back up to Washington we got our Honda Accord out of storage and hit the road. We had already sold all the real-estate we owned, and our battle plan was to spend 5 years on the road (our kids had bets among themselves we wouldn't last 5 weeks living full time in an RV.) So, from December 2001 to March 2018 we lasted almost 16 ½ glorious years in our Alfa.

In 2003, we went to an FMCA rally in Indio, CA. We had met another Alfa motor home owner and I said maybe we should start up a chapter for Alfas. He said, yeah, go get the paper work. So, I went and got the paper work, didn't see him again and about 4 months later after meeting other Alfa owners we were at an AOC rally in Sevierville, TN and I was asked if I still had that paper work. I did and turned it over to Bruce Monte, who became our first president. He took it, filled it out, and we got at least 15 Alfa motor home owners together in an impromptu meeting and chartered the AlfaSeeYas FMCA Chapter. I was forced to be some sort of officer, so I became the Alternate International Director. Later, I became the National Director for about 4 years. Sometime later, I started up www.AlfaSeeYas.com and we were on our way to, at one point, having over 700 members in our chapter.

This story could go on for at least 50 pages of all the places we have been, all the friends we have acquired, just over 70,200 miles, 2 sets of tires, 11,822.5 gallons of diesel, 1355.5 gallons of propane, just over \$25,000 in maintenance (lube, oil changes, filters, tires, 4 microwaves, 2 refers, 3 refer cooling systems, 2 re-carpets, resealing, batteries, etc, etc.), \$9000 in improvements (LED Tvs, Winegard sat antenna, Samsung refer, GE convection microwave, etc, etc.).

Sadly, we sold it last March. But, you know what? If we could, we would do it all over again in a heartbeat. It was a great life. It has been a great experience for me and Sharon and we have now purchased a home in Sun City West, AZ. We would still enjoy the Newsletter if you could send it our way. We're keeping all our friends. We still visit regularly with some of them.

FMCA Governing Board Meeting and Rally Report

Gillette Wyoming (July 18-20, 2018)

I would like to say up front, the experience of attending the Rally in Gillette was exciting and very enlightening. We (Diana and I) met many new people and experienced many new adventures. The fact that there was a Governing Board meeting was the icing on the cake.

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To start off, the day before the official Governing Board Meeting, we attended a National Directors Briefing and Orientation. Delegates were encouraged to attend this seminar to learn more about the Governing Board meeting and the processes. National Directors, Alternate National Directors, and temporary delegated received valuable information on how to efficiently handle the upcoming business before the Governing Board, the following day. We reviewed the proposed items and agenda. This meeting took place in the main meeting hall and about 80%, of the several hundred delegates, attended. Each major item to be presented to the entire Governing board was explained and the procedures to follow, during the official meeting, were explained. This was a great help, it brought to light the reasons for many of the proposals and the pros and cons of each. The following day at the Governing Board meeting, approximately 68% of all FMCA Chapters were represented. The items presented and voted on were:

- **Proposed Constitutional Amendments:** These were mostly procedural in nature dealing with Rights of Members for refunds and "On Line/Written Ballot Voting". Online voting would be a new thing and will bring more of the membership into the loop when major decisions are proposed. These will be presented to the membership and possibly initiated in the future.
- **Proposed Bylaws Amendments:** There were several amendments proposed, one with respect to Commercial Members (Passed), Dues and Assessments refunds must be approved by the Executive Committee (Passed) and the most controversial PROPOSAL #7. This proposal that would have redefine the structure of the Governing Board, along with Proposal #8 they (DID NOT PASS). As a result, the makeup of the Governing Board will continue to be made up of an individual representative from each chapter, as it has been for many years. These two proposals were not recommended by the Executive Board and were presented to the Governing Board ONLY because they were presented by petition and were required to be place on the agenda by the bylaws. (It appeared the petition came from members that did not belong to a chapter and would have removed individual chapter representation.)
- **Policy and Procedures:** Many P&P's were discussed and were referred to the respective P&P committees as well and the Executive Board. Items voted on related to the Approved Constitutional Amendments and Bylaw changes I.E. FMCA Campground Software (passed), Clarification of (RV) Recreational Vehicle, Commercial Membership fees and dues, Allocation of Expenses for Travel, and

Clerical changes that needed to be make relating "motor coach or motor home' to "recreational vehicle" as well as the update of the name of the magazine to "Family RVing".

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In the past the Governing Board Meeting usually lasts all day and sometimes in to the evening hours.

However, this meeting went so well and the information was presented so well that we finished all items on the agenda and the meeting was adjourned, at 12:00 noon for lunch.

GENERAL MEETING: At the open general meeting and during the Presidents Report the status of FMCA was discussed in detail. Over the years membership was decreasing, revenues were decreasing and participation in rallies was decreasing. However, with the significant changes made by the Executive Board and the Governing Board all three item have made significant increases. In addition, to the turnaround in membership, revenues and rally attendance, FMCA has added and improved many

benefits. (To include FMCA assist, Road Side Assistance, Store discounts, VA discounts, additional tire discounts, Health Plans for those under 65, RV pet safety programs, Sponsored Mail service, WIFI programs through Verizon and FMCA sponsored insurance programs.) FMCA has always been an organization owned and operated by its members and they are committed to continuing to provide its members with high quality lower cost services. In addition to the usual meetings, Diana and I hosted a get together, at our ALFA, of all of the ALFA owners that were at the rally.
