As you know, this year's FMCA conventions and almost every Area rally and some of the Chapter rallies have been cancelled for the rest of 2020. The January 2021 Western Area Rally in Indio, CA is postponed until January 2022. The October 2020 Rocky Mountain Area Rally in Tucson, AZ is rescheduled to October 2021. The September 2020 Eastern Area Rally in Lewisburg, WV is cancelled. However, the 2021 FMCA Conventions are still on schedule for March in Perry, GA and July in Gillette, WY. And the Areas are still moving forward to hold rallies during 2021. The FMCA leadership and staff are also working hard to roll with the punches and keep a positive outlook for the Association as they work with local and State officials and event venues to keep event and activity planning moving forward in 2021.

As I reported in the last newsletter, the Executive Board formally met June 5th, and approved a budget for the 2021 fiscal year. The \$230,000 deficit budget retained the membership benefit FMCAssist and left the annual family membership dues as they are. Since that time, the Board has met several times to continue to discuss the 2021 budget with an eye on retaining FMCAssist as a no additional cost benefit to the members while also trying to reduce/eliminate the deficit.

To that end, a special meeting of the Executive Board was held on Thursday, August 6, 2020, via teleconference. During that

meeting the Board members were reminded that they approved a deficit budget on June 5, 2020, and that they met on July 14, 2020, to review a new, replacement budget that was presented to the Board by the Finance Committee which offset the deficit with cost and revenue adjustments such as reducing dues to \$50 per year, eliminating FMCAssist as a no-additional cost member benefit. This proposed budget resulted in a \$75,000 surplus. A motion was made at the July 14th meeting to postpone action on the proposed budget until the Board members had ample time to review and discuss the numbers. The Board members were reminded that this proposed budget, as recommended by the Finance Committee on July 14th, was to be voted on at this time. A roll call vote was taken. The motion on the proposed 2021 fiscal year budget failed with 2 votes "for" and 11 votes "against." Since this budget failed, the budget passed on June 5th remains the adopted 2021 budget until the Board votes to revisit it in the future.

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Our thoughts and prayers go out to Ken Hall and Shirley Beemer and their respective families on the loss of Ellen Hall and Joe Beemer. Both were exceptional people that I had the fortune of meeting and getting to know through this great hobby we share. I will miss Ellen's bubbly smile, and Joe's jokes and great stories.

Skip Huffman continues to post updates on Facebook about his recovery from COVID. Although he is not 100%, he is improving, and the therapist and doctors are extremely impressed with his recovery. Skip keep up the good work!

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

Batteries!

I saw a most interesting article in the August 2020 MotorHome Magazine which got me to thinking.... We had replaced our 'front' batteries and had a problem getting them connected correctly. I know we weren't the only ones as I saw any number of email messages asking for help on the Groups.io mail list. About a year or so later we woke to an awful stench and discovered our 'back' batteries had been seriously compromised.

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I know there are wiring diagrams as well and plenty of discussion in the 'files' of the mail list but I am going to give a quick reminder of just how important our batteries really are...

So, what is the first thing you need to know about batteries?

Our RV's have two different battery needs:

- •House (inverter) batteries
- Chassis batteries

Chassis (starting) battery:

- •This starts and runs the engine
- Are rated in 'Cold Cranking Amps' (CCA)
 - •CCA is the number of amps the battery can deliver at o degrees F for 30 seconds
- •Should NOT be used for 'deep cycle' applications

House (inverter) battery:

- •Supplies 12v to the RV
- Need to be 'deep cycle'
 - *Designed to provide a steady amount of current over a long period.
- •Should NOT be chassis or marine batteries
- •Are designed to be deeply discarded and recharged repeatedly
- Are rated in Amp Hours (AH) and possibly Reserve Capacity (RC)
- •The amp hour rating is basically how many amps the batter can deliver for how many hours before the batter is discharged.

The life expectancy of your RV batteries depend on YOU!. How they are used, how well they are maintained, how they are discharged and how they are stored. (If the battery is discharged to 50 percent everyday, it will last twice as long as it would if it is cycled to 80 percent.)

What does all of this mean to you? That depends on how you use your RV. If most of your camping is done where you are plugged into an electrical source then your main concern is just to properly maintain

your deep cycle batteries. But if you really like to get away from it all and you do some serious dry camping you'll want the highest amp hour capacities you can fit on your RV.

Deep cycle batteries come in all different sizes. Some are designated by Group size, like group 24, 27 and 31. Basically, the larger the battery the more amp hours you get. Depending on your needs and the amount of space you have available, there are several options when it comes to batteries.

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The two most common causes for RV battery failure are **undercharging** and **overcharging**. Undercharging is a result of batteries being repeatedly discharged and not fully recharged between cycles. If a battery is not recharged the sulfate material that attaches to the discharged portions of the plates begins to harden into crystals. Over time, this sulfate cannot be converted back into active plate material and the battery is ruined. This also occurs when a battery remains discharged for an extended period of time. Sulfation is the number one cause of battery failure. [Note: this is what happened to our chassis batteries! jmh] The second leading cause of battery failure is overcharging. Overcharging batteries results in severe water loss and plate corrosion. The good news is both of these problems are avoidable.

What is the role of 'house' (inverter) batteries?

- Lighting
- HVAC
- Appliances
- Entertainment Systems
- Electric Steps
- Electric Awnings
- Slideouts
- Leveling Systems

Remember, your batteries are the foundation of your motorhomes' power system. Be sure to take proper care of them!

A yummy recipe - Buttermilk Spice Muffins

Serve: 12

Preparation time: 5 minutes Cooking time: 20 to 25 minutes'

Ingredients:

Muffin Batter:

1 c sugar
1/2 c butter or margarine
3 eggs
2 1/2c flour
2 tsp baking soda
1 tsp nutmeg
1/2 tsp cinnamon
3/4 c + 1 tbsp buttermilk

Nut Topping:

I/2 c sugarI c walnuts (finely chipped)I/2 tsp cinnamonI/2 tsp nutmeg

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 375°. In a mixing bowl, cream the sugar and the butter using an electric mixer. When thoroughly mixed, add eggs and beat one more minute.

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- 2. Sift the flour into a separate bowl, together with baking soda, nutmeg and cinnamon.
- 3. Add the flour and buttermilk to the first mixture; mix at low speed until smooth.
- 4. Make the nut topping: Mix all ingredients together in a small bowl.
- 5. Great muffin tins or use paper baking cups. Fill each cup 3/4 full of batter. Add a full rounded tablespoon of nut topping on top of each muffin cup of batter. Bake immediately or the topping will sink to the bottom of the muffin.
- 6. Bake 20 25 minutes until golden brown and toothpick/tester comes out clean.

Note: Don't have buttermilk? Stir in a teaspoon of either lemon juice or white vinegar to your milk and let it sit for about 10 minutes.
