The Feast of Saint Valentine was established by Pope Gelasius I in AD 496 to be celebrated on February 14 in honour of Saint Valentine of Rome, who died on that date in AD 269. In 18th-century England, it grew into an occasion in which couples expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards (known as "valentines"). Valentine's Day symbols that are used today include the heart-shaped outline, doves, and the figure of the winged Cupid.


Since the 19th century, handwritten valentines have given way to mass-produced greeting cards. In Italy, Saint Valentine's Keys are given to lovers "as a romantic symbol and an invitation to unlock the giver's heart", as well as to children to ward off epilepsy (called Saint Valentine's Malady).

Recipe - Broccoli Cranberry Salad

I love a GOOD broccoli salad and have been searching for many years for a recipe that will provide such a salad. I think this is IT.... (Some years back, hubby and I stayed at a KOA campground in Greybull WY. We stopped at a local grocery store for supplies and brought home some of their broccoli salad. Oh my gosh - it was MORE than yummy!!)


Salad

5 cups broccoli florets, cut into 1-inch pieces
1/2 cup red onion, chopped
1 cup sharp cheddar cheese, shredded
1 cup bacon, cooked and crumbled
1 cup sunflower kernels
3/4 cup dried cranberries

Dressing

I cup mayonnaise or similar salad dressing
I/4 cup sugar
2 Tbsp red wine vinegar
I/2 tsp salt
I/4 tsp pepper

Combine all salad ingredients in a large bowl; mix well. Combine dressing ingredients in a small bowl; using a fork or wire whisk, mix until smooth. Add dressing to salad; blend well. Refrigerate 1 hour to chill. Makes 6 to 10 servings.

AlfaSeeYas Chapter Outing News

Last summer (July 2020), Leigh and Suzanne Conner, and myself, went to Eagle Nest, NM and spent 6 days at the Golden Eagle RV Park. Eagle Nest is located in the NE part of New Mexico, at an elevation of about 8500 feet, about 9 miles NE of the resort town of Angel Fire. The folks at the Golden Eagle RV Park were very friendly (they even own an Alfa motorhome!), and we talked with them about the possibility of having a chapter outing/rally there in Sept 2021. They have a small restaurant (with good food - including BBQ once or twice a week), plus a separate room that we can meet in and have our own meals/socials if we desire. They have a pontoon boat that the RV park owner will take us out on the nearby lake to see the dam, and also out on fishing trips for guests - free of charge. September should have good weather (not too hot or cold during the day, cool at night).

There are several restaurants and shops in the small town of Eagle Nest, and there are more shops and restaurants in the nearby larger town of Angel Fire. Angel Fire is a ski resort in the winter; they do give rides up the ski lift in the non-snow months, which provides a great view of the valley. Angel Fire also has a beautiful Vietnam War Memorial (chapel, museum and gift shop - with a pretty view of the valley), established by a man whose son was killed in the war.

About 26 miles west of Angel Fire is Taos, NM - a larger city with lots of things to see and do, plus a number of shops and restaurants. One of the things we did was to drive to Taos for the day. We both have dogs, and used a highly recommended "doggie day-care" facility in Taos to take our dogs to while we spent the day in Taos. The main requirement to have our dogs stay there was to make sure they had a Bordetella shot (mine didn't, so I used a nearby vet to do so). One of the things we did in Taos was to take a bus tour of the area, where we saw a number of interesting sites, restaurants and shopping areas. We talked to the tour company owner - he could give us our own private tour - which would include a tour of the Pueblo Indian reservation, where we could have a special lunch prepared by the Pueblo Indians for us - hopefully we can do so within whatever Covid-19 restrictions may exist at the time. We just need to have a minimum of 20 people to arrange a private tour. We may make this an optional item on the Rally registration form.

Eagle Nest is most easily reached by taking Highways NM-58 and US-64 off of I-25 just north of the small town of Springer, NM, heading about 43 miles west to go head up to Eagle Nest. The last several miles are fairly curvy, but not really a problem for even large RVs. There are other ways to reach Angel Fire/ Eagle Nest - from the south and from the west from Taos - but the way in from I-25 near Springer is the one most recommended for larger RVs.

Suzanne, Leigh and I will be the co-wagon masters for this AlfaSeeYas chapter outing. We are planning it to be from Sept 10-17, 2021. The Rally rate will be about \$45-\$50 per night for a 50-Amp site, paying for 6 nights, with the seventh free. The RV park will honor the Rally rate for a few days prior and after the outing too. We will likely arrange to have some meals catered (as we usually do at our chapter outings), social gatherings, and also see about arranging any group meals at local restaurants - as folks may desire.

We are looking for expressions of interest from chapter members if you think this outing is something you would like to do (so far we have folks in 11 RVs interested). Guests (and non-Alfa RVs) are also welcome. We would like to have at least 20 persons interested to also arrange the private bus tour.

If you could send us your interests no later than Apr 15, 2021, that would be great! We will also be sending out registration notices through emails, social media and the chapter newsletter.
